#### Vicar's letter . . .

Dear Friends,

Perhaps I am unusual or the odd one out, but I love the wind. Recently we have had a lot of high winds, Storm Kathleen being the most recent named storm. It may be the wind in the hair, the power of being blown about or the manner in which the sea is whipped into an angry mass; I'm not sure, but I find it so inspiring.

It seems as though there is strength coming from nowhere, literally thin air, not visible, other than its effect and impact that we can see.

In the Church year, we are coming up to Pentecost, when the disciples were gathered in Jerusalem waiting for the arrival of the promised Holy Spirit of God. How would they know that God, in the person of the Spirit, had arrived? As it happened, the evidence was clear, unambiguous and dramatic.

The Holy Spirit was seen as tongues of flame on the heads of those present, they began speaking in languages which were not their own, and for which they had never been trained or had any knowledge. Then there was the wind, the breath of God moving among them.

It was an exciting and disturbing time but, in the confusion, there was clear purpose and direction; this was not chaos, it was planned, organised and supremely delivered. In the Spring we once more open our windows, and the gust of wind disturbs the papers on our desk. So it is with God, the Spirit leads and directs in ways that we had not foreseen; but we yield, because God knows us better than we know ourselves.

This Pentecost, let us be open to the moving breath of God in our life.

### **Children and Families Update**



On Good Friday, Lawnsmead was overflowing with local families who joined us for a morning of 'Exploring Easter through Arts, Crafts and Stories'. A happy, buzzing time was had by all, and the children left with craft bags overflowing with their creations. Same again next year!

Easter at St. John's was an exciting time! David and I, along with Sally and Gussie from Christ Church Shamley Green, were delighted to run an Easter Garden Workshop for the children in Years 2-6 at WSG Primary. The efforts and energy that the children (and parents) put into their gardens was incredible. Each and every one was both unique and similar, showcasing the children's individual imaginations while staying true to the Easter story. We were able to display many of them at St. John's over Holy Week, and it was so good to welcome many families on Easter Sunday as they came to view them and join in our celebratory service.



Two new initiatives are happening this term:

- We are restarting our All-Age Services. They will take place at 10am on the first Sunday of each month, with the first one being 2<sup>nd</sup> June. As the name suggests, all ages are welcome, including families who are new to the idea of church and want to find out a bit more. It will be interactive and 'light touch', with a 'Kids' Space' room of activities in case younger children become restless.

Through this, we offer a week's worth of homemade meals to those experiencing significant life events, such as the death of a loved one, the birth of a new baby, illness or recovery post-surgery. 

### **Meet Hilary Goodridge**



I'm Chairman of the Wonersh and District Garden Club.

I trained in fashion and pattern cutting. My first job was in a Fashion House in Albemarle St in the West End. I moved with a friend to a boutique in Walton Street designing and making clothes for sale in the boutique. After a year or so my friend and I started our own business making clothes for London high society including wedding dresses.

Eventually we decided to go our separate ways. I got a job in Norway, in the only Fashion House in Oslo. I made clothes including some for the Royal Family. After a year I returned home and first lived in Barnett Lane in 1967. I had my first son who was baptised at St John's, Wonersh. After four years I moved to Bramley and had my second son. I had a Saluki dog that I used to exercise on Chinthurst Hill with the children, almost daily.

In 1988 my present husband Mike and I moved to our present house Chinthurst Lodge, which I had known when Peggy Paynter lived there. Peggy organised driving old people to the day centre which I helped with then, and still do now. Peggy took a big interest in the Club; we have the Paynter Cup awarded to the member with the most points at the Autumn Show. I have also presented the Chinthurst Cup for Best in Show entry, in the Autumn Show.

My husband first saw Chinthurst Lodge, and garden, in the dark. It had an acre of garden. I said I could manage it as my husband is not really a gardener. We put in an offer that night without seeing the garden in daylight. By this time I was teaching both dressmaking and soft furnishing through Adult Education and gardened in between. I also had two horses at home; they kindly produced manure for the garden!!! Luckily we had an amazing gardener, Graham Titchmarsh (distantly related to Alan). Graham did an amazing job adding a lot of interesting herbaceous plants, shrubs and trees. I learned a lot of what I know now from him. Graham was a member of the Wonersh Garden Club during that period.

At Peggy Paynter's funeral, I met Brigadier Fraser Scott, who opened his garden through the National Garden Scheme. He suggested we should open our garden. We have been opening our garden to the public for the last thirty years for the NGS. We now only open for groups by appointment in May, June and July.

Our gardener now is Clair Gunner, who is also secretary of the Garden Club. During the latter part of the pandemic, I managed to sell many plants in aid of the Club which enabled us to get good speakers. The Club is thriving, with approximately 70 members. We meet in the Wonersh Memorial Hall on the first Wednesday of the month: speakers during the Winter, two shows and garden visits in the Summer. They also provide 16 children in their care with full-time education at local schools, plus housing, food, clothes and transport. Their goal is to educate the children to a level where they can move on to choose a career, train, receive a diploma, find employment and become independent.

### Tribute to Mike Woodhouse (1927 - 2024)

If you live in The Street, or thereabouts, you are likely to have been invited to one of Mike's Christmas parties. Not wanting anyone to be missed out, he didn't have one party but two each year on consecutive days. The food and drink were lavish, his pleasure at seeing each guest was warm and welcoming and, although he gave a suggested arrival time, no leaving time was given. This was Mike: generous, kind, warm, welcoming.



Once he retired he attended the Monday Lunch Club, not simply to be there but to be the Wine Waiter, wine that he supplied. He also organised the men who were responsible for putting up the tables and arranging the chairs. Only recently, on hearing that he had died, those at the Lunch Club were commenting on the way he made everyone feel special, whether or not he knew you well, as if you were the only person in the room.

Having retired, he came on to the Age Concern Committee and, around 2004, he initiated Open Gardens and lunches in the village. These continued for about 10 years and, after they had stopped, a Summer Party has continued for those who live in The Street, rotating around the different houses. Prior to the parties, Mike always used to organise a wine tasting session in his lovely garden to choose which wine would be served! He remained very supportive of Age Concern, encouraging those who came to the parties to donate to the charity. This continued right up until last year by which time he was 95!

His incentive for all these parties was because he was very aware that villagers could be lonely, especially the elderly, and he wanted to give opportunities for neighbours to gather together. He had a large pastoral heart, caring deeply for those who were unwell, bereaved or needy in other ways. He would phone, he would visit, he would take people out for lunch, all because he cared.

He loved his garden, delighting in others enjoying it too. If he saw a passer-by stopping at the drive to catch a glimpse, he would invite them in and show them round. If he offered you flowers it wasn't a handful but an armful! Sometimes flower arrangers at the church were invited to help themselves.

It wasn't until he was in his 80s that he wanted to join a Homegroup. His faith had always meant everything to him and he wanted it to grow and to understand more by being able to discuss with others. He attended those Tuesday meetings until very recently. Receiving Holy Communion was his lifeblood, and when he was unable to get to Church any more, sharing in a Communion Service in his home was an enormous privilege. He truly was 'lost in wonder, love and praise,' which now he is enjoying even more.

What a loss to The Village he is. What a privilege to have known him. Mike, we miss you.


